- Layed the foundation for Student Lead Ministry, with the formation of a new teen praise band, ministry groups on Wednesday evenings, which equipped students to serve and lead.
- Created a 3rd teen Sunday School class called, "Going Deeper."
- Had 3 lock-in events at the church.
- Two students were called into ministry.
